An Introduction to Blues Turnarounds, Intros and Endings

Harmonic turnarounds reflect the jazz influence on the blues They are based on typical chord progressions used in jazz standard tunes (the repertoire of songs that jazz musicians like to play) The progression used the most is I-vi-ii-V This progression is used in many jazz blues standards
